



I'm so proud of the entire library staff who wear multiple hats as they serve the public every day. Librarians who help bridge the digital divide and provide instruction on the ever-changing resources available through the library play the role of teachers, as do those who do a cooking demonstration or lead a craft or writing workshop. There are DIYers, makers, storytellers, singers, performers, chefs, and book club leaders among the library staff who use their talent to entertain and educate. Librarians serving children and youth occasionally assume roles as caretakers, discipline enforcers, or playmates.

Many of our librarians are readers, reviewers, and evaluators as they evaluate books and other materials before purchasing them and adding them to the collection that patrons love to browse and borrow. They are information professionals - compiling information

in various formats, archiving and storing documents and images for easy search and retrieval, and ensuring equitable access. They compile statistics and reports to preserve history while at the same time develop strategic plans and prepare for the future, thus they are archivists and futurists.
