In an age dominated by screens – phones, tablets, and computers – how do we resist their siren call and cultivate focused reading time? When a group of book critics and authors were asked about their reading habits, they offered various tips that might help those of us aspiring to read more.

Many recommend always having a book at hand, allowing you to sneak in a few pages while waiting at the doctor's office or during your commute. Other strict habits of avid readers include devoting a half hour or more to reading before kids wake up or after they've gone to bed; maintaining a list of books to read in a month; tracking completed books on platforms like Goodreads; and strictly blocking out time for reading.

For some, joining a book club provides the necessary impetus to read and discuss a particular book, while others prefer the solitude of private reading. [Check out the various book

clubs at the library on Page 2 of this newsletter.] Prolific readers often juggle more than one book at a time—perhaps a print book, a Kindle e-book, and an audiobook. But does the location of reading truly matter? Some readers cherish favorite reading nooks at home, while others enjoy reading in a park, on a treadmill at the gym, or on vacation at the beach. And what about the physical book itself: is it important to preserve its pristine condition, or is annotating acceptable? Bestselling author Geraldine Brooks famously stated, "I would no sooner write in a book than deliberately gouge a scratch in an antique table or scribble on a painting."; Her husband, however, "read with pen in hand, scrawling his thoughts all over the place."

Beyond personal reading habits, reading aloud to young children is a powerful way to strengthen bonds between adults and kids, foster children's imaginations, and associate reading with pleasure and excitement. When families dedicate quiet reading time for everyone, it demonstrates to children that adults also read for enjoyment, laying the foundation for a lifetime of good reading habits.

We invite you to share your own reading habits with us—where and when you like to read, your preferred format, and of course, whether you prefer to borrow books from the library or buy them.
