A LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR



The library takes its role of inspiring learning and empowering our communities seriously. We offer diverse collections of materials representing all perspectives suitable for recreational and scholarly pursuits. We also invite contemporary fiction and non-fiction writers, thought leaders, philosophers, and subject experts to speak on topics that might appeal to a wide swath of community members.

Since 2021, the Shrewsbury Public Library Foundation has been sponsoring one or two lectures annually, as part of its Distinguished Speaker series. We partner with the public and private schools and host the author talks at one of the school auditoriums to accommodate a larger audience.

On Wednesday, April 8th, we are honored and excited to welcome Jill Lepore, distinguished historian and law professor to Oak Middle School. Lepore is the David Woods Kemper '41 Professor of American History at Harvard University and Professor of Law at Harvard Law School. A prolific writer, her books include, *These Truths: A History of the United States*, *The*

Secret History of Wonder Woman, *The Whites of Their Eyes: The Tea Party's Revolution and the Battle for American History*, and the most recent, *We the People: A History of the U.S. Constitution*. She is sure to appeal to lovers of history, law and politics.

Another beloved author and naturalist that we will host at Oak Middle School on Tuesday, April 14th is Sy Montgomery. Through her books for children and adults, she explores the underwater world of the octopus, narrates her experiences working in a hospital with abandoned turtles, shares her wonder of all animals from cute hummingbirds to predatory hawks, and writes of a pig named Christopher Hogwood, who came to her in a shoebox, and that she raised to be "a 750-pound Buddha master adored by adults and children alike." Montgomery will be sharing insights into the hidden lives of octopuses, and our connection to the natural world. At both events, books will be available for sale and signing.

In conjunction with Sy Montgomery's visit, we are encouraging everyone in the community to read her books as part of our community-wide reading project throughout April. This project complements the themes in her work with a series of related programs, including visits from Animal Adventures and the Turtle Rescue League, as well as participation in the town-wide Arbor Day event.

By inviting well-known authors and commentators to address our community, SPL continues to be a literary and civic hub and endeavors to enrich the lives of our residents.
