A Letter from the Director

Thoughts for this newsletter began on a warm spring day in early April, as I sat at the traffic light on Main Street, gazing up towards the building. I noticed that the daffodils were beginning to bloom. There are many mornings I arrive at this spot, and look up at the building with admiration. The bright splash of yellow from the flowers looked so spring like and really complemented the building so well. At another time I observed how the painting of the exterior wood trim on the windows and fasciae of the 1903 Ward Building greatly spiffed up the whole appearance of the building. I've also noticed that if I arrive early enough to work, and the sun is low in the sky, I can enjoy the lovely way the sunlight reflects off the slate roof. It gives a special glow to the whole area. There have been times when drivers behind me have to give me a beep of the horn to send my attention to the changed light.


There is much to admire inside our library building as well. The spectacular stained glass window in the original stairwell, with the classic wood paneled walls and the bold patterned carpet, provides a space that would be hard to find in many other public buildings. And of course, the front reading room, with its curved multi-paned windows and simply designed brick fireplace, provide a cozy space for reading and relaxing. There's another interior spot that catches my fancy, of which most people will be unfamiliar. From a southeast facing window in the second floor kitchen/staff lounge room, you can enjoy a unique perspective of the St Mary's Church spire and its surrounding neighborhoods. A more bustling but attractive view can be seen from the second floor meeting room, with west facing windows that look out over the Main, Grafton and Boylston Street intersection.

There are many times I pause to admire the lovely design of our historic library building. My perceptions tend to evolve around the views I encounter in my regular activities in and around the building. A new view was provided when one of our regular patrons shared a photo taken during the Spirit of Shrews-bury Festival last fall. Of course, I saw the pumpkins, but almost immediately, I noticed how wonderful the library looked. I just loved the view of the illuminated pumpkins in the foreground and the sleepy looking library building in the background. While its true that I have some bias towards the library, I know others have affections for the library building.

Local contractor Keith Baldinger, whose children love the library, has taken on a project to build a smaller shed to replace the large shed, which had to be demolished. (It was

too costly to repair and maintain- and it's removal offers more flexibility for future parking development.) Keith has taken it upon himself to replace the shed with a simple wood building with the help of a few other local builders and donations from local supply companies and others. Keith told me he has a daughter who is a super reader and he wanted to give something back to the library.

Another contractor recently responded to a call for assistance by helping to remodel the staff lounge/meeting room kitchen area. It was a crowded uncomfortable space with little storage for supplies and equipment for the meeting room. Matt Beaton of Shrewsbury heard about the situation and donated the labor and materials to add a new lunch counter for staff—and more shelving

per team.


youth vs. adults trivia

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


