A Letter from the Director

In this issue I'm going to update you on the status of our library building project. Before doing so however, I'd like to share with you a statement from our Library Values Statement—as well as one of the principles that's guided me in my professional life. First the library's value statement—At the SPL, "we communicate openly and reliably with our staff, our users and our community." My personal principle is "just be honest." Thus I'll let those statements set the tone for this letter.

I write this letter on July 26, two weeks after the State announced the awards for the Massachusetts Public Library Construction Grant program. I'm sure you have read the press coverage by now and know that Shrewsbury was approved for a \$7,959,989 grant, but will need to wait for release of the grant funds in a future fiscal year. We were ranked as number 8 on a list of 15 communities that must wait for future funding.

Here's where my personal and professional ethics are tested. I'm not going to tell you that I was thrilled with the news. I was actually rather heartbroken. But the intervening week has given me a chance to pass through the stages of grief (shock, anger, a bottle of wine...) and reassess the situation. Matters have turned around considerably and we have a much more positive outlook now.

To explain the change, let me describe what "waiting list" status means. Shrewsbury has been approved for a \$7,959,989 grant but must wait our turn (8th in line) for the funds. The money for the 15 communities on the waiting list will come from two sources. The initial portion will come from what remains of a \$100 million Library Construction Bond Bill approved by the State Legislature in 2008. Just over \$68 million remains in that bond. Once those funds are expended, any projects remaining on the waiting list will need to wait for the legislature to approve more state bonds for library construction.

With help from our local legislators, we began assessing how long it would take to receive the grant funding, and how secure we could be in eventual receipt of the funds. Senator Michael Moore and Representative Matt Beaton were invaluable in sorting through the intricacies of the state's capital plan and the status of the Library Construction Bond Bill. Town Manager Dan Morgado and I worked with the MBLC to confirm possible timelines for the grant funds. We learned that there is adequate capacity in the existing bonding authority to fund 8 of the 15 waiting list projects —and that those funds are scheduled to be fully released by fiscal year 2015.

This means that Shrewsbury will begin to receive grant funds by July 2014, or possibly even earlier. No further applications will need to be submitted. Good news to be sure! The Board of Selectmen and the Board of Library Trustees will be working together in the coming weeks to assess the situation and determine a new timeline for the project. All are committed to addressing the conditions in our existing building and creating an improved building that will meet the needs of the community. I expect that by the time this newsletter appears in your mailbox, we will be close to announcing that schedule. After the first press coverage on the grant announcement, many residents spoke to Library Trustees or staff to express their concern on the grant outcome. They were passionate about the need to press on. I'm so happy to now be able to share this good news. I hope that you will join me today in celebrating, as we now know that all will be well!

Thank you for your patience and your support.

P.S. What's all this GEEK stuff about?




