
service. They make me feel so proud to be associated with SPL. I know that when people say SPL is a great library, much of that credit goes to our staff.

Throughout this past year, as I've watched the remodeled and expanded building being completed, and then seen the tremendous surge of use by people of all ages. I feel such gratitude to the people of Shrewsbury and the donors who have provided this lovely new building. They have provided a lasting gift to our community. I am also thankful for the amazing team that worked on this project. We were so fortunate to have had architects Lamoureux Pagano Associates, contractor Fontaine Brothers, Inc. and project management firm PMA Consultants working together to create this exceptional building. State Library officials have remarked that it is one of the smartest designs they have seen! In observing how patrons use the building, I can easily confirm that. This building is both beautiful AND functional!

And I am grateful for the kind words of thanks and support we have received from many library users and residents. One of my happiest experiences this week was running around to a number of area banks which our library foundation uses. I was picking up balance printouts on their various CD's for the foundation's bookkeeper, and had the delight of hearing from the clerks at each bank how much they loved the library. One was a grandmother who spoke of how much her daughter enjoys bringing her grandchild to the new library. A clerk at another bank, when she learned I worked at the library, exclaimed "Oh I love the new library. It's so futuristic!! I love the check in machine and all the computers. It's so cool!" And finally another clerk told me her high school son raves about the group study rooms and the vending machine for after school snacks. While I know that not all are as enthusiastic about new library, it was a delight to hear so many words of approval from such a random group.

I often have library visitors stop and thank me for my work on the project. I always remind them that it took a very large team—and their generous support. As we start this New Year, I must say "thank YOU!"
