Online Genealogy Resources

General sites

- 1. <u>Cyndi's List</u>: Over 280,000 links to online genealogical resources, including forms, tutorials, databases, etc.
- 2. <u>Stephen P. Morse</u> databases: Links to Ellis Island & Castle Garden records; passenger ship records; U.S., Canadian & BRitish census records; SSDI, etc.
- 3. <u>U.S. Census</u>: Records from 1790-1940, with 1950 coming in 2022; also available through Ancestry.com and HeritageQuest.org
- 4. <u>Social Security Death Index</u>: Contains names of most deceased people who had Social Security cards from mid-1930s to present; includes birth & death dates, last place of residence, where last SS check was mailed, SS number, state where SS card was issued
- 5. <u>Ancestry.com</u>: Giant database containing over 5 billion records, including census, military, and passenger ships; access for free in the library
- 6. <u>Heritage Quest</u>: "Home" version of Ancestry.com; includes U.S. census records, genealogical books, Revolutionary War documents, Freedman's Bank records, etc. can be accessed free from anywhere using your SPL library card
- 7. <u>Rootsweb</u>: Free database made up of data submitted by volunteers; a good place to start, but also be sure to verify this information with other sources
- 8. <u>American Ancestors</u> (New England Historic Genealogical Society): Extensive databases that include historical journals, magazines, vital records, land and probate records, family and local history books, etc. Some free searching available, but membership fee required for full access
- Family Search (Mormon Church database): The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints (LDS) has been collecting genealogical data from around the world for over a century. It has the largest collection of genealogical information in the world, and much of it is available online, free of charge. Specific microfilms can be ordered for minimal charge and viewed at a local Family History Center (closest is 67 Chester St., Worcester)
- 10. <u>Genealogy.com</u>: Articles on genealogy and forums based on topic or surname; no membership required, but information may be limited

- <u>Allen County Fort Wayne Public Library</u>: Another large genealogical library collection; largest subject index to genealogical and historical periodical articles; original compiler of PERSI
- <u>PERiodical Source Index</u> (PERSI): A comprehensive family history resource with over 2.5 million entries from thousands of historical, genealogical and ethnic publications
